The 63rd State-Level Annual Convention of the Maharashtra State Secondary and Higher Secondary School Headmaster's Association was held with great enthusiasm on the 12th and 13th of April 2025 at the Sir Vishveshvaraya Auditorium, Konkan Krishi Vidyapeeth, Dapoli, Ratnagiri District.

The convention commenced on Saturday, April 12, with a ceremonial flag hoisting by the convention president, Mr. Sunil Pandit. Following this, the council and executive committee meetings of the federation took place. During the meetings, Mr. Ayyub Mulla, President of the Ratnagiri District Principals' Association, and Mr. Sandesh Raut, Treasurer of the State Federation, presented a comprehensive overview of the event's planning and organization.

At 12 noon, the inauguration ceremony was held. The welcome address was delivered by Minister of State Mr. Yogesh Kadam. Distinguished guests present included Convention President Mr. Sunil Pandit, State Federation President Mr. Tanaji Mane, Working President and MLA Mr. Dnyaneshwar Mhatre, Secretary Mr. Nandkumar Sagar, and Chairman of the Konkan Divisional Board of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Mr. Rajesh Kshirsagar.

Former presidents Mr. Arun Thorat, Mr. Subhash Mane, and Mr. J.K. Patil were also present. During his inaugural address, Minister Yogesh Kadam pledged that not a single Marathi medium school in Maharashtra would be allowed to shut down.



In the afternoon session, on behalf of the Kolhapur District Association, Mr. R.Y. Patil presented a research paper on the topic "Comparative Study of CBSE Pattern vs. State Education Boards in Maharashtra." The session was chaired and guided by former Federation President Mr. J.K. Patil.

In the evening session, office bearers of the federation were felicitated. A recreational trip to Murud Beach was organized for all attending principals by the Ratnagiri District Principals' Association. Later that night, a regulatory board meeting was held, during which resolutions to be submitted to the government were discussed in detail.



On Sunday morning, a research paper titled "Quality Enhancement Campaign" was presented by Mr. Prasad Gaikwad on behalf of the Pune District Association. This session was guided by former Federation President Mr. Arun Thorat and Secondary Education Officer of the Pune Zilla Parishad, Dr. Bhausaheb Karekar.

Here's why it plays such a central role:



1. Shapes thoughts and perceptions:

Language doesn't just express thoughts- it also shapes them. The words and structures available in a language can influence how people perceive the world and conceptualize ideas.

2. Builds identity and Culture:

Language carries cultural and personal identity. Writers and artists use it to express who they are, where they come from, and what they believe in. Language plays a crucial role in preserving and celebrating cultural diversity.

3. Creates emotional resonance:

Through metaphor, rhythm, tone and word choice, language evokes feelings and moods. A well-crafted phrase or sentence can stir deep emotional responses or provoke thought.

By carefully choosing the language that conveys urgency, passion, or a call to action, creators can

influence their audience to think critically, challenge norms, or take part in a cause.




